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01. ABOUT THE RAYAT SHIKSHAN SANSTHA:

Late Padmabhushan Dr. Karmaveer Bhaurao Patil alias Anna established the Rayat Shikshan Sanstha at Kale. Tal. Karad, Dist. Satara for imparting education to all with the promise of self-help, self-culture, self-knowledge irrespective of caste, creed, color or community. It is this secular aspect of the institution that is derived from the Father of the Nation who christened the first boarding at Satara as the “Chhatrapati Shahu Boarding” in 1927.

The Rayat Shikshan Sanstha is not only the institution of academic excellence but also a laboratory of social transformation. Karmaveer Anna believed in the principal that education is an instrument of social change. He started more than 500 voluntary schools all over Maharashtra without any financial aid from the Government.

02. ABOUT THE COLLEGE:

The college with its Arts, Commerce and Science stream Pachwad established in June 1991. Our college is affiliated to Shivaji University, Kolhapur. In 2001, the Arts, Commerce and Science College, Pachwad was renamed as Yashwantrao Chavan Mahavidyalaya, Pachwad in the honour of Late Shri. 04. ADMISSION GUIDELINES:

1. Admission to B.A. and B.Com. Degree courses shall be given as per the University and Government rules.
2. Students who have passed H.S.C. examination in Arts and Commerce streams shall be admitted to B.A. Part-1 and B.Com. Part-1 respectively. However, a student who has passed XIIth Science examination can seek admission to B.A. Part-1 as well as a student who has passed Vocational Course at the +2 stage can seek admission to the B.A. part – I
3. There is a separate admission committee for each class.

4. The Principal reserves the right to amend / modify the guidelines regarding admission as and when such amendments/modification are received from the University, Government & Management.
5. Reservation rules prescribed by the State Government from time to time and adapted by the University.
6. Parents / students are requested to go through the guidelines and admission notices displayed on the notice board and college website before seeking admission to the college.
7. Changes in rules and regulations, if any, shall be displayed on the college notice board and college website from time to time.

4.2 ELIGIBILITY

- ii) Those who have failed in the above stated examinations will not be considered for the admission.

07. CO-CURRICULAR AND EXTRA – CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

*** NSS (National Service Scheme):**

Our college has unit with the strength of 100 students. The enrolment to the unit is done according to the guidelines laid down by Shivaji University, Kolhapur. This unit aims at enhancing awareness of social, cultural and environment domains among students through various community – oriented programmes such as Blood Donation Camp. Adult Literacy, Health Education etc. A special camp of 7 days duration is held at a village adopted by the College.

• Gymkhana:

The Gymkhana conducts Annual Sports Competition. It provides facilities for various indoor and outdoor games. The college has its own spacious playground.

• Library:

The college has well equipped library Centre. There is a huge collection of books, reference books periodicals, web-based reference data which is easily made available for the college. Our college library also provides reference books of competitive examinations such as MPSC/UPSC/SSB/Banking etc. Besides our library Centre provides free internet access to the students. The staff of the library works with the aim of enriching the knowledge resource and easy access of it for the students.

Schemes:

- 1) **Borrowing Facility for Students:** Each student borrow two books (Duration 7 days)
- 2) **Book Bank Facility:** A set of text books is issued to students for the academic year as per their demand.
- 3) **Special scheme for differently abled students:** Our library provides a set of books for handicapped students of our college on totally free of cost basis.
- 4) **Internet Facility:** A Large number of resources are available on the web. The broad band internet facility is available in the library for students and faculty. It is free of charge for faculty and students.
- 5) **User Orientation:** Orientation to the fresh students for effective use of library and awareness about the services are given in the month of June/July of each year. Library also organizes various competitions such as ‘Best Books Reviewer’ etc.
- 6) **Mobile library** – This Scheme is aimed to encouraging school students and villagers to read books. Student’s volunteers work as Librarian in their area. They issue and collect their books provide to the students and villages.

9. Discipline and Code of Conduct:

The student admitted in the college has to abide with the following rules. Violation of any rule may result in the disciplinary action including the expulsion from the college.

- i. Every student must have an identity card with his/her own photograph duly attested by the Principal. He/she is expected to have his/her identity card during his/her stay in the premises of the college.
- ii. Self-discipline is the best discipline. All the students are expected to observe rules and regulations currently in force to enable smooth working of the college.
- iii. The student must attend lectures, internal examinations and tests regularly and tests regularly and punctually.
- iv. Every student should note that minimum 75% attendance is required for periods in order to be eligible for the grant of terms. If a student fails to get his /her terms granted, he / she will not be allowed for the annual examination.
- v. In case of illness, student should apply for leave along with doctor's (MBBS)

certificate and should report to the principal immediately after the recovery, without which the term will not be sanctioned.

- vi. The behavior of the student in the class as well as in the college premises should be such as to cause no disturbance to the overall discipline of the college.
- vii. The students are strictly prohibited from undertaking or doing any activity not connected with the college without the prior permission of the Principal.
- viii. No student shall collect money by the way of contribution for picnic, trip/visit to some place, get together or any other activity without the prior permission of the Principal.
- ix. The students are expected to take proper care of the college property and help in keeping the premises neat and tidy. Causing damage to the property of the college, disfiguring the wall etc. will be treated as breach of the discipline and will be finally dealt with.
- x. The college is not responsible for the personal belongings of the students.
- xi. The students applying for any certificate. Testimonial etc. or requiring the Principal's signature on any sort of documents or applications should first contact the office in-charge.
- xii. "Gutkha" chewing is strictly prohibited in the college.
